Owing to the death of her brother, Nurse Mahady, Night Nurse in the Infirmary, was obliged to leave home on 30th Ultimo. [Leave sanctioned.]

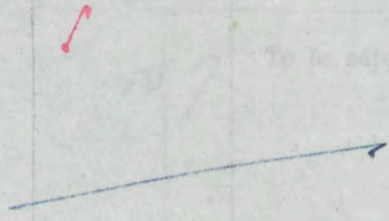

Letter No. 18158/22, dated 24th June, 1922, referring to replies to queries respecting the employment of Mrs. Kate Dolan as Temporary Overseer in the Hospital Laundry and requesting to be informed how this work had been hitherto discharged, and as to the necessity for making the appointment; also whether Mrs. Dolan was still employed in the capacity of Temporary Seamstress.

Resolved - To inform the Minister for Local Government that the former Matron of the Workhouse Superintended the laundry work; her office was abolished on the reduction of the establishment due to its conversion into a District Hospital, and Mrs. Dolan, who was acting as temporary seamstress at

15/-

15/- per week, was given the additional duty of Superintending the laundry and her wages increased to £1 per week for the new duty and for continuing to act as seamstress. At the same time one of two paid laundresses was dispensed with, and the cost of the laundry work on the whole thus much reduced.

Read letter from the Manager of the Ardee Branch of the Hibernian Bank, Ltd., dated 27th June, 1922, stating that now that that Bank had been appointed Treasurer of the Union he would like to have an arrangement come to as to payment of interest on overdrafts. The rates he proposed were: One-half per cent. under Bank's minimum rate to be changed on overdrafts, and the current deposit rate to be allowed on credit balances. These rates at present are, respectively, four per cent. and one and a half per cent. It would also be well to arrange a limit for overdrafts, as he had to obtain the sanction of the Directors for any advances.

Resolved - That as the Hibernian Bank at the guardians' request undertook the Treasurership of the Union and commenced the account with a considerable overdraft, the guardians consider it only fair that the Bank should be allowed interest according to the rate proposed in the Manager's letter until the present overdraft be extinguished; after which the normal conditions of the Union Treasurership, according to the rules of the former Local Government Board for Ireland, should govern the appointment. The guardians consider that the figure named for the maximum overdraft, be £5000.

Resolved - That Mr. Thomas J. Sharkey, who has

has taken stock at the workhouse for some years back, be allowed £3, the usual remuneration, for taking stock at the end of last half-year (31st March, 1922).

The Clerk reported that Mrs. Kate Carroll, Superannuated Maternity Nurse of the Workhouse, had not yet paid for some articles of furniture sold to her by the guardians on her leaving the workhouse. The amount due was £5.

Ordered - That payment of Mrs. Carroll's Superannuation for last quarter be withheld from her, until she pays the amount due by her.

Letter No. 111/17 of 1922, dated 19th Oct. 1922, referring to an

entry in the Guardians' Minutes of the 14th May 1922 on the subject, and

stating that they had sanctioned the undermentioned scale of salaries for the Dispensary Midwives in this Union. The scale is to be retrospective in each case only from the 9th October 1920:

Mrs. Noonan Ardrie D.D. - Initial salary of £55 per annum, increasing by £5 every ten years to a maximum of £75 per annum.

Mrs. Ward, Castebellinham D.D. - Same scale as above.

Miss Finnegan, Dunbea D.D. - Initial salary of £40 per annum, increasing by £5 every ten years to a maximum of £60 per annum.

Mrs. Goudie, Dunbea D.D. - Same scale as Miss Finnegan's.

Resolved - That the Board would respectfully request the Ministry for local government, to make the scale in the case of Mrs. Ward, the Midwife of the Castebellinham Dispensary District, retrospective from the date of her appointment, as recommended by the Guardians in their minute, so as to allow her the benefit due to her from her long and faithful service. Mrs. Ward was appointed in 1890, and has consequently 32 years' service, and she is now an old woman. She has for some time been receiving a salary of £45, with £10 per annum bonus: i.e. total £55; so that under the scale as sanctioned she would financially be left in no better position than she has been, as it would require eight years more from now for an increment to mature, when in all probability she will be no longer in the Board's service.

Circular No. L. G. 16/19/22, dated 31st October, 1922, urging attention to compliance with the Vaccination Acts

Acts owing to the presence of Small-pox in England and Wales, and asking the Guardian to require that notice be served on all defaulters, and that the Medical Officers specially report the results at the end of a month.

O'Hagan, Medical Officer of the Fonthellbellinham Dispensary District, on his resignation of that office, with the consent of the Ministry of Local Government, as stated in the minutes of the Guardians' meeting of 23rd January, 1923.

Proposed by the Chairman (Mr. Campbell) seconded by Mr. Meade, and unanimously Resolved - That Dr. Patrick J. O'Hagan, having served as Medical Officer of the Fonthellbellinham Dispensary District for over 43 years, and having resigned said office, with the sanction of the Ministry of Local Government, be granted a Superannuation allowance of £204.17.5 per annum, being two-thirds of his salary and pensionable emoluments calculated on the average of the past three years.

Resolved - That this Board proceed to appoint a Medical Officer for the Fonthellbellinham Dispensary District, in room of Dr. O'Hagan, retired, on this day four weeks, 3rd April, 1923, and that advertisements be issued accordingly.

That the salary commence at £250 per annum, increasing by quinquennial increments of £10 per annum until a maximum salary of £300 per annum is reached. Vaccination and Registration Fees to be additional to salary. [The Order No. 1 Rural District Council have also fixed

fixed a salary of £15 a year as Medical Officer of Health - the same amount so has been hitherto paid for that service - for the incoming Medical Officer.]

The Medical Officer appointed must reside in the Dispensary Residence belonging to the Guardians, and whose tenant therein ^{such officer} will be during his tenure of office as said Medical Officer, at a rent of £12 a year, the tenant paying all rates and keeping the premises (including the portion used as the Dispensary) in repair. The premises will be put into a reasonable state of repair before the Medical Officer goes into occupation of them. The Guardians will allow one ton of coal annually for the heating of the Dispensary, and the Medical Officer will be required to see to the care and the heating of that compartment.

The appointment to be permanent, but subject to such adjustment as any future rearrangement of Dispensary Districts by the Ministry of Local Government may entail.

The Guardians would feel obliged for the immediate consent of the Ministry to the salary, as fixed, so that the appointment may be advertised.

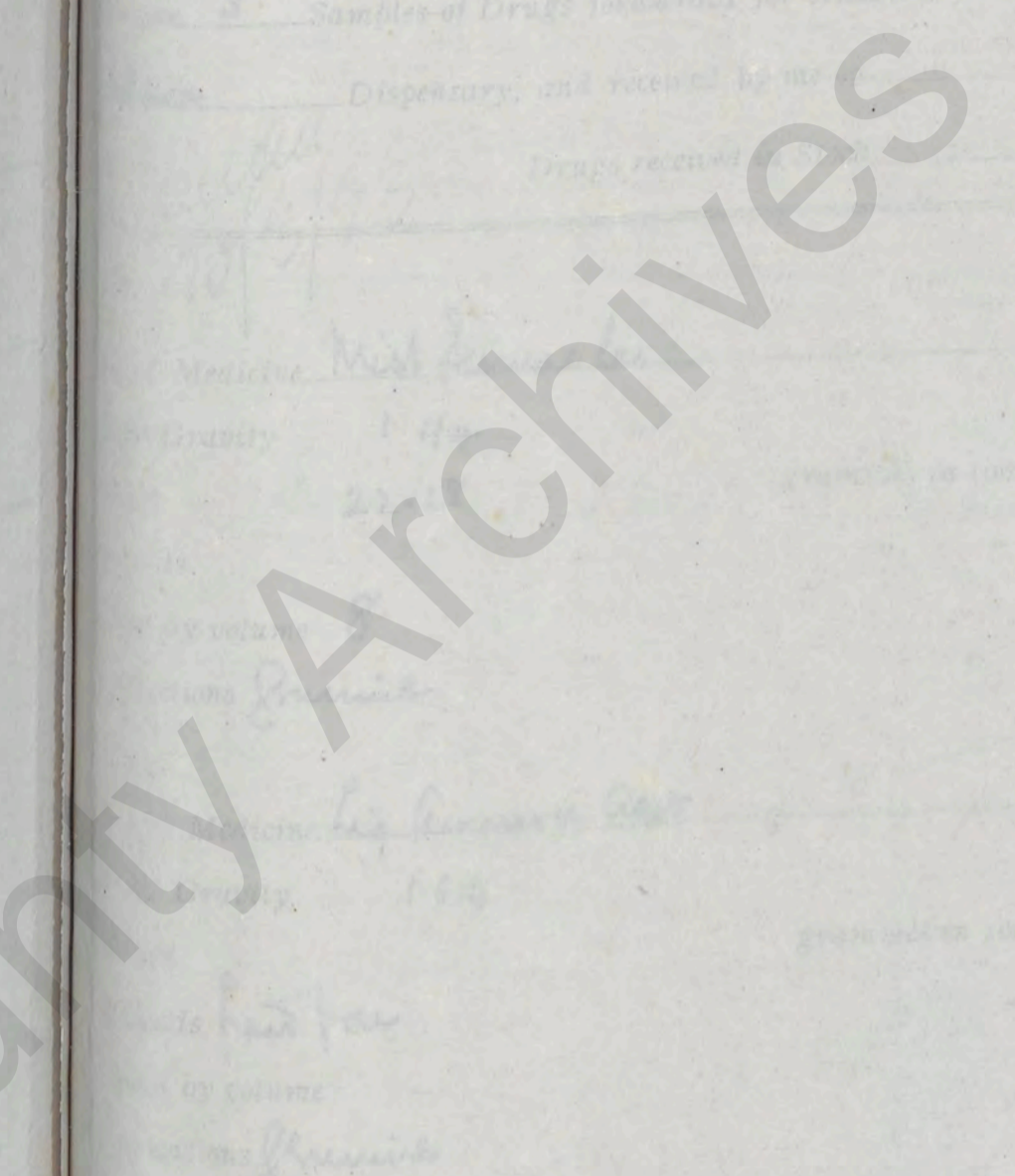

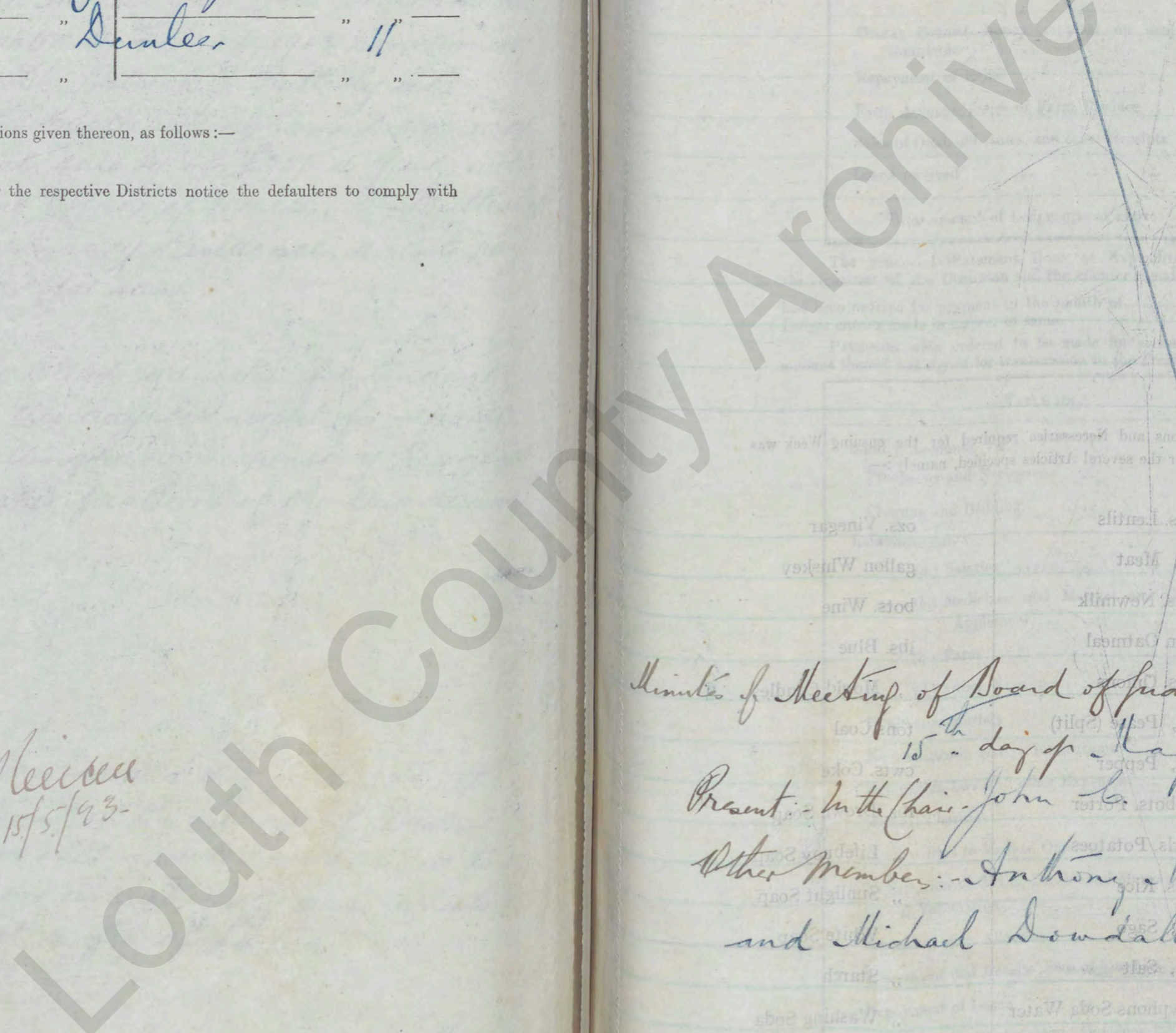

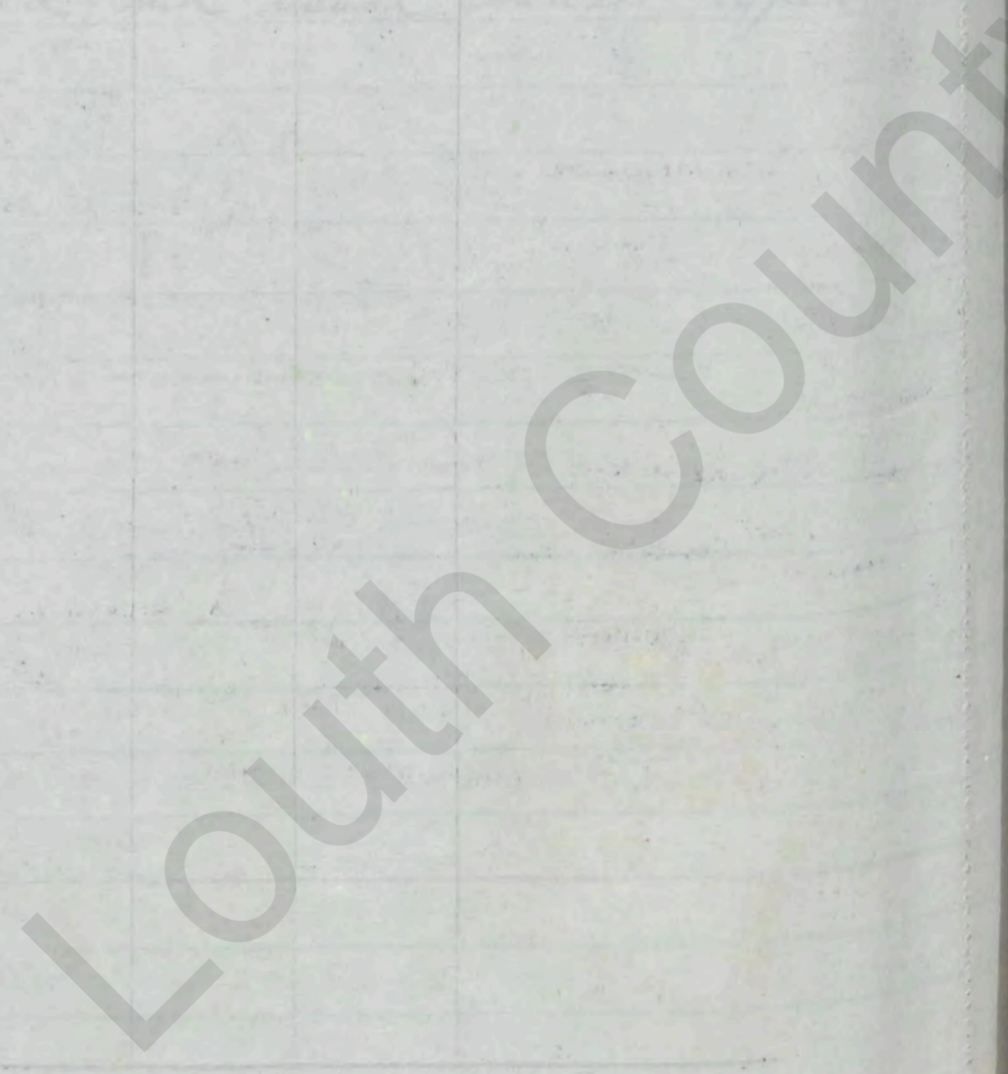
